The Early California Population Project: A Genealogical Treasure A special joint program of CGS and Los Californianos

The early Hispanic settlers of Alta California (part of which is now the state of California) were called Californios or Californianos. Los Californianos was organized by their descendants to preserve the Hispanic heritage of Alta California (history, music, culture, infrastructure, etc.) and to help other descendants compile their Hispanic genealogy. Come to CGS to hear from a member of Los Californianos and see the resources in the CGS collection about the early Hispanic settlers of our state. Tax Records: More Exciting Than You Might Think Presented by Annette Burke Lyttle

Tax records can help us locate our ancestors in place and time. They can tie our ancestors to land or confirm for us that an ancestor did not own land. They can help us follow ancestral migrations and separate samenamed persons. Sometimes they can help us pinpoint a death date or timeframe. Tax records can act as censuses between the censuses. The variety of taxes levied by governments at all levels has left a rich record of our ancestors' lives and their sometimes-changing fortunes.

### Family Day at Angel Island Immigration Station

Save Saturday, June 17 for Angel Island Immigration Station Foundation's Family Day. Take the ferry for a picnic with family and friends. There will be activities and programs and you can visit the new Angel Island Immigration Museum located in the former hospital building and the former immigration barracks. Several genealogical volunteers will be present to assist you in researching your family records (bring immigrant's name(s), birth date,

immigrating year, naturalization year if possible). A special roundtrip ferry ticket that includes lunch from the San Francisco or Tiburon piers and shuttle van to the immigration station is

available for \$10 for the day. (https://www.aiisf.org/familyday). \*

The Angel Island immigration station was in operation from 1910 to 1940 and was a locked facility for third class -steerage immigrants arriving by ship from China, Hong Kong, India, Japan, the Philippines, Russia, Austria and many other countries - a total of eighty in all. Each immigrant underwent questions regarding their status to enter the U.S. through interrogations, documents, and physical exams and were detained anywhere from overnight to two years. June 17th is a day of remembrance and to honor our ancestors who endured the procedures to become our families' first generation Americans. It is a day to celebrate.

\*There are no other ferries going to Angel Island except SF and Tiburon. From the East Bay & Penninsula, Take Bart to The Embarcadero stop. then walk across to street to SF's Ferry Building's Pier 1/ B to catch the ferry. You must pre-purchase your ferry tickets to get the discounted package (**https://www.aiisf.org/familyday**).
