• July 5th - "Got Questions?" - Any questions are welcome. Join

discussion loader Que Coverson to find answers to your generalised

questions. We will also refer you to others if needed. Sue Severson is a long time genealogist and volunteer at the OFSC. She has been researching her family for years and especially enjoys helping others with their DNA.

- July 12th FamilySearch.org topics Connecting with Others on FamilySearch. The FamilySearch Family Tree is a collaborative tree with contributions from many, many people. Your aunt may contribute photos of your great-grandparents, your cousins may contribute an interesting family story, and your grandparents may contribute Bible records with dates and places. You see names of contributors all over your ancestor's pages. This class will show you the many places on the pages you can find these contributors, how you are related to them, and how you can contact them. Connecting with others can help you grow your family tree and become more familiar with their lives and times. Denise Plaskett has been building her family tree and helping others since 1982. She is a volunteer at the Oakland FamilySearch Center and loves to share her knowledge of FamilySearch with others.
- July 19th Free subscription databases at OFSC- Swedish Research and ArkivDigital. ArkivDigital: the premier resource for Swedish genealogy is the only resource you need forSwedish genealogy and is available free at the Oakland Family History Center. ArkivDigital is a young and aggressive Swedish company that's currently filming Swedish church, military and civil records. It also has excellent databases of transcribed records, created by native Swedes. This is the resource that native Swedish genealogists use. Wade Olofson is a Swedish specialist at the Oakland FamilySearch Center and has been researching Swedish genealogy since 2007.
- July 26th General Genealogy Topics African American Research. Patricia Smith Jenkins will discuss some historical challenges when researching African Americans in the United States and a few strategies found to break through brick walls. Pat grew up in a multigenerational household in New Jersey immersed in family history. Travel during the summers reinforced family connections and sparked her interest in genealogy. Retired from UC Berkeley as a Manager of the Early Childhood Education Program, Pat spends her free time researching family histories and encouraging others to do the same. Pat facilitates monthly research and discussion groups for the African American Genealogical Society of Northern California and Oakland California FamilySearch Library.
