
NOTE: The building does not circulate outside air on weekends. We do use a fan and circulate the air inside the library.

Tips and Talk

Tips and Talk classes at the Oakland Family Search Center are catching on and we hope to see you there soon!



These discussions are free to all! They are one hour long and will be given only at 11:00am for the months of July and August. Each Wednesday will have a different focus.

Come early and stay after for additional hands-on assistance and to take advantage of the amazing resources at OFSC.

- August 2nd "Got Questions?" Come and get answers to your genealogical questions. Bring your lunch and continue the discussion!

- August 9th FamilySearch.org topics "Improbable Connections" DON'T MISS THIS SPECIAL EVENT! The presenters, one white and one black, began a collaborative research mission to identify a common ancestor in central Virginia. They will discuss the historical context, their findings, and the meaning and value of their story for genealogical research and education. Patricia Smith Jenkins retired from UC Berkeley as a Manager of the Early Childhood Education Program. Martha A. Jessup is a family historian, retired research scientist, and Professor Emeritus of nursing, from the University of California San Francisco.
- August 16th Free subscription databases at OFSC-"Fold 3 Military Records" If you want to find a record of your American or British ancestor's military service, Fold3 is the first place you should go. Owned by Ancestry, Fold3 is a vast online collection of military records and other historical documents and photographs. The site is much more than a fancy search box, however: it allows you to filter by conflict, country, and military branch, and to browse records by military unit and place. These features allow you to deepen your historical understanding and learn what you don't yet know you don't know. Join us for this overview of Fold3 and demonstration of how it can deepen your research or help you break through that brick wall. Evan Wilson is a professional genealogist who specializes in the Southern US, DNA, and brick walls. What he brings to this topic is not an expertise in military research, but rather a love of research and of the tools that help us learn about the past.
- August 23rd General Genealogy Topics "Beginning Your German Genealogy" Wherever you are in your ancestral journey, your challenges are shared by others. Exchanging and discussing these challenges can open new pathways through your brick wall as well as inspire the voyages of your fellow researchers. Among essential and perennial topics: discovering the villages of origin of your German ancestors and then using those discoveries to access centuries of records in German archives, now increasingly online, to build family trees of astonishing depth and detail. We'll address these and other issues in general and focus as well on your specific challenges. Robert Jackson, Harvard history PhD, has been engaged in German research for decades and looks forward to discussing your questions, ideas, and theories.
- August 30th -- General Genealogy Topics -- "Beyond Online Resources:
 Other Places to Look for Your Family" So much information is online
 today but there are many other resources that can be useful to advance
 your research. Join Jane Lindsey as she describes "offline" resources
 and encourages you to walk away from the computer and discover
 places that hold a wealth of information that can grow your family tree.

Improbable Connections

The presenters, one white and one black, began a collaborative research mission to identify a common ancestor in central Virginia. Coursing through three generations of slavery, they discovered eight paths of connection. They will discuss the historical context, their findings, and the meaning and value of their story for genealogical research and education.

Patricia Smith Jenkins retired from UC Berkeley as a Manager of the Early Childhood Education Program. Pat spends her free time researching family history and encouraging others to do the same. Pat facilitates monthly research and discussion groups for the African American Genealogical Society of Northern California and the Oakland California FamilySearch Center.

Martha A. Jessup is a family historian, retired research scientist, and Professor Emeritus of nursing, from the University of California San Francisco. A 2017 trip to Virginia led her to an unknown great-aunt who was buried in the cemetery of a Black church and where she found family from the community of Shores, Virginia. Marty conducts research on the people enslaved by her ancestors and her connections to those family lines.

AppGen provides the student with a unique online genealogy education experience with a high degree of instructor-student interaction utilizing a practicum-based approach. The founders believe that "Learn by Doing" is a more effective way to gain knowledge by putting those newly learned skills to use immediately.

Class size is small (15 maximum). All assigned student homework is commented on by the instructor. Courses are 4-5 weeks long which gives time to study and process each week's information and to do the exercises.
