
Thank you for celebrating with us!



How To Order Surplus Books

Email

Send an email to <u>library@californiaancestors.org</u> stating which book you want to buy and providing your name and address where you want the book mailed to. We will calculate the postage and inform you of the total price. You can send us a check and we will mail the book to you.

Donation

On the CGS Donation page, you can make a donation of the price of the book plus postage, and specify in the Note box that you want to buy a specific book from our Surplus Books list in the CGS enews. The Donation page allows you to pay via Pay Pal or via mail. When we learn that you have done this, we will

mail the book to you.

Visit the Library in Person

Send an email to <u>library@californiaancestors.org</u> to make sure the book is still unsold and tell us that you want to come in person to pick it up. If we reply that it is still available, then you can come in during our open hours, and you can pay with cash or a check and take the book home with you.


