

Enrollment Ledger of the Association of Territorial Pioneers

Individuals in this file were members of the Association, a male lineage organization formed in 1876. Membership was based upon arrival before statehood, 9 September 1850. If a member died before the organization disbanded in the early 1890s, the date of death and a reference to a memorial obituary in a second ledger is entered.

Information includes name, place of birth (often detailed), age or date of birth, occupation, residence, date of arrival in California, route traveled and for some, details of the trip to California.
